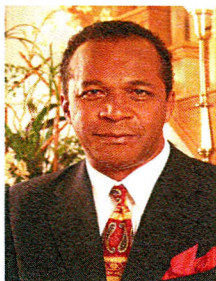


Rev. Dr. Clifton Davis



He is an actor, singer, composer, producer and minister. For more than 30 years Clifton Davis has shared his unique gifts

with audiences and congregations around the world. He served as Executive Director of Welcome America, Inc., the non-profit company that produces the Independence Day Festival for the City of Philadelphia, PA.

Davis holds a BA in Theology from Oakwood College, Huntsville, Alabama and a Master of Divinity degree from Andrews University in Michigan. Davis has received an honorary Doctor of Ministry degree and is also the recipient of an honorary Doctor of Letters degree from Lincoln University. The recipient of more than 120 awards and citations for his social, civic and spiritual service, Dr. Davis is listed in "Who's Who In America." He has been recognized by such organizations as The Southern Christian Leadership Conference, World Vision, the UNCF and the NAACP. Dr. Davis served as Associate Pastor at the Loma Linda University Church for two years, and then spent two years in prison ministry.

As a revivalist, Dr. Davis has preached at literally hundreds of churches throughout the nation. During the last four years, he served as co-founder and co—Pastor of Welcome Christian Center of Huntington Beach, California. Davis is an ordained Christian minister, licensed by St. Luke Baptist Church, New York, NY. His interdenominational ministry spans more than

24 years during which he has evangelized throughout the nation, leading thousands to the love of God through Christ Jesus. On Christian television, Davis hosts C.A.T.S. (Christian Artist Talent Search) on INSP Television, is the host of "Backstage Pass" on TBN, and he ministers for "Praise the Lord" on the Trinity Broadcasting Network. He has also hosted such notable gospel music specials as "Gospel Superfest", "Take It To The Bridge" and "The Stellar Awards".

From January 1995 to September 1996, Dr. Davis served as Vice Chancellor for Development & Planning at Elizabeth City State University in North Carolina. Mr. Davis served as Honorary Membership Chairman of the National Parent Teacher's Association from 1989-91 and has served on the advisory council for The Children's Defense Fund. He has hosted numerous telethons and is a celebrated motivational and keynote speaker having spoken at more than 150 colleges, universities and high schools over the years.

Dr. Davis is probably best known for his 5-year run as Reverend Rueben Gregory on the popular NBC television series, "Amen." *He has appeared in many films and on Broadway over the years.*

Davis received a Grammy nomination for his hit composition, "Never Can Say Goodbye." As a singer and recording artist, he has enjoyed success with his album "Gospel Greats," on Benson Records, and has performed in concert around the world. Dr. Davis is an avid golfer, licensed pilot and a certified scuba diver. However, his greatest loves are his Lord Jesus Christ, his wife, Monica and his 2 children; 28 year-old son, Christian, and 24 year-old daughter, Holly.
