

Mrs. Rhonda Harrison-Lewis

Rhonda A. Harrison-Lewis, a native of Nashville, NC, graduated in 1970 from Northern Nash High School, Rocky Mount, NC and entered North Carolina Central University. After earning a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1974, she returned and was awarded a Masters of Arts Degree in Counseling in 1975. Later, she continued her studies at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and North Carolina State University.

Mrs. Harrison-Lewis was employed as a library aide, completed a practicum, worked fourteen years as a guidance counselor, and from 1992-2002 served as Coordinator of Guidance and Counseling, all at Hillside High School.
